ROSE THEATRE

This was the first playhouse to be located in Bankside in 1587, and the first purpose-built playhouse to stage a Shakespeare play. It was excavated in 1989, and was only given full legal protection after many campaigns were held to save the remains. When they excavated the site, the floor was still littered with fruit seeds and hazelnut shells from 400 years ago.

OCTAVIA

Octavia Hill was an English social reformer who spearheaded the building of social housing.

She was strongly opposed to governmental intervention in housing, and she believed that well-managed homes led to happier lives. By 1874, Hill had built 15 housing schemes that housed 3,000 tenants. Not only did she believe in housing for the poor, but also that it was the right for urban workers and her tenants to have access to open spaces. She protected many rural areas around London and stopped Hampstead Heath and Parliament Hill from development in 1875.

One of her closest community spaces that Hill built is The Red Cross located in Southwark.

BISCUIT TOWN

The Peek Freans factory opened in 1873 and quickly began to expand.

Due to the large amounts of biscuits being made, Bermondsey was encased in a sweet biscuit-y smell which resulted in the nickname 'Biscuit Town'. The factory was very much like its own mini town in that it had a post office, fire station, free medical, dental and optical services and was open for 126 years. It was here that the Bourbon, Garibaldi and chocolate digestive were created.



HAWKER

A hawker is someone that would sell items on the streets, usually by chanting and shouting. In the late 1800s, there were around 30,000 hawkers on the streets of London, with the highest concentration on the streets of Southwark. They would usually use a donkey cart or a barrow to transport the goods and bring children with them to shout.

The louder they were, the more trade they would get. A common characteristic of a hawker was a coarse or even hoarseness to their voice.

RIVERBANK

The riverbank of Southwark is home to many attractions including the Tate Modern, the Clink, Shakespeare's Globe just to name a few. Not only that but it is home to 5 bridges which connect Southwark to the City of London. The Romans were the first to build a bridge to connect to a smaller settlement, that is now known as Southwark. By building 'London Bridge' it allowed for the 4 major road systems in the north to be joined with the 4 major roads south of the river. The current London Bridge was opened in 1973 by Queen Elizabeth II.

GREEN MARKET

The Green Market is one of four sections located within Borough Market. The Green market is where you will find the small, specialist produce traders.

CARNIVAL

The Bermondsey Carnival is a community festival whose history dates back to 1901. Unfortunately, in the 1980s the carnival ceased to exist and it was not until 1997 that it was relaunched again by two local residents. It is a festival that allows for the local community to enjoy a day of free entertainment, music and dance.



GOLDEN HINDE

The Golden Hinde is a replica of a multi-level deck ship that was used in Sir Francis Drake's maritime exploration of the world during 1577 to 1580.

The replica was launched in 1973 and has since sailed to the USA, Japan, Panama and Canada. In 1996, she was berthed at St Mary Overie Dock where it is still located today.

PILGRIM

The Pilgrims Way is a historical route supposedly taken by pilgrims in 1172AD to the final resting place of Saint Thomas Becket after his martyrdom a few years before.

The route starts from Southwark and ends in Canterbury. So famous is this Pilgrimage that 'The Canterbury Tales' written by Geoffrey Chaucer is a series of 24 stories that recount a group of pilgrims travelling to Canterbury from London to visit the shrine of the Saint.

The prize for the completion of this pilgrimage was a free dinner at the Tabard Inn upon their return to Southwark.

CROSSBONES

Crossbones was the final resting place for some of the poorest citizens of London, as well as 'Winchester Geese' - medieval sex workers that were licensed by the Bishop of Winchester.

By the time the burial site closed in 1853 it held roughly 15,000 people's remains. It was rediscovered in the 1990s due to planned work on the Jubilee tube line and since 1996 it has been made into a shrine for the deceased.
